Career & Internship Advising

We consult with students on strategies to gain experience in order to test career ideas, discover ways to gain new skills, and translate the value of their L&S degree to the world of work. We also assist with the "tools" of attaining experience such as: networking and search strategies, building a LinkedIn profile, BuckyNet navigation, resume/ cover letter feedback, interviewing, and job/salary negotiation. Jobs/Internship Database & For-Credit Courses

BuckyNet is our password-protected interactive online system which connects students and employers. Through BuckyNet, you can search and apply for internships and full-time opportunities, post your resume, and sign up for on-campus interviews and much more. Sign up at careers.ls.wisc.edu INTER-LS 260: Internship Course for Credit, an online course that is open to all students and is aimed at providing a framework for a reflective academic experience. Day in the Field and Job Shadow Programs

In the Job Shadow Program, individual students meet one-on-one with professionals, observe their jobs for a day, and learn first-hand about the organizational structure of an employer.
